

Directions from North New Jersey via Route 1:

Take Route 1 South toward Trenton. You will pass Perry Street Exit and you will get off next exit. The Exit will be labeled Trenton Train Station. You will get off the exit and proceed to traffic signal. Make left at signal and proceed under Route 1 get in the far right lane and follow the signs to the Trenton trains station. Go through two lights and turn left at the second light, 44 S. Clinton will be on your right.

Directions from North Jersey via Train:

Take the NJ Transit Northeast Corridor line to the Trenton train station. Once you have arrived at the station walk out of the station using the main entrance. We are located across the street on your right at 44 S. Clinton.

Directions from South Jersey:

Take I-295 North to 129 toward Trenton, which is Exit 60. When you get on 129 you will take it to Exit labeled Hamilton Avenue. You will make right turn onto Hamilton Avenue. At next traffic light you will make left onto South Clinton Avenue. Proceed to the second traffic light and continue straight thru the light, 44 S. Clinton will be on your right.

Directions from South Jersey via Train:

Take the NJ Transit RiverLINE to the last stop, which is Trenton. We are located across the street on your right at 44 S. Clinton Avenue.

Electoral Responsibilities

Outline of Primary Electoral Responsibilities for the Election Offices in New Jersey

A. New Jersey Attorney General (through the Division of Elections):

1. Chief Election Official in the State to assure compliance with both the federal National Voter Registration Act (NVRA), and the Help America Vote Act of 2002 (HAVA) which includes reporting requirements to the Election Assistance Commission, respectively.
2. Certifies voting machines for use in all elections.
3. Filing Officer for all federal and state public elective offices.
4. Oversees compliance with polling place accessibility for elderly and voters with disabilities.
5. Regulatory authority for voter registration, political party declarations, absentee voting, and election district requirements.
6. Clerk of the Board of State Canvassers, which certifies federal elections and state office and public question elections. The Board consists of four members of the Legislature.

B. County Superintendent of Elections (in ten counties of New Jersey):

1. County's Commissioner of Registration, responsible for review and maintenance of the County's voter registration records.
2. Custodian of the County's voting machines.
3. Police Powers to enforce election laws pursuant to Title 19, Election Laws of New Jersey.

C. County Board of Election* (in all 21 counties):

1. Recruits, appoints, trains and supervises district board workers.
2. Certifies the polling places, which require inspection to insure compliance with accessibility requirements.
3. Canvasses and counts absentee and provisional ballots.
4. Issues challenger permits and badges.
5. Conducts election recounts, under court order.
6. Establishes and maintains election districts.

** In those eleven counties without the Office of County Superintendent of Elections, the County Board of Election acts as the County Commissioner of Registration and custodian of the voting machines, but does not have police powers.*

D. County Clerk

1. Filing Officer for nomination petitions for county offices and petitions for independent municipal candidates.
2. Designs and prints ballot materials (i.e., absentees, emergency, machine strips, provisional and sample ballots).
3. Publishes the notice of absentee ballot availability for any statewide, countywide or school election in a regional or other school district comprising more than one municipality.
4. Reviews absentee ballot applications; if approved, sends out ballot materials; if rejected, notifies voter.

Electoral Responsibilities

Outline of Primary Electoral Responsibilities for the Election Offices in New Jersey (cont'd)

5. Clerk of the County Board of Canvassers (which is the four member County Board of Election), which certifies election results for county, partisan municipal and school elections.
6. Filing Officer for Election Law Enforcement Commission reports by county and municipal candidates.
7. Issues Certificates of Election to county and municipal candidates duly elected at general elections.

E. Municipal Clerk

1. Voter registration office for the receipt of voter registration and party declaration forms.
2. Recommends polling places to the County Board of Election.
3. Assists County Superintendents and Boards of Election in assuring the proper conduct of an election.
4. Publishes the notice for absentee ballot availability in any municipal election or in school election for a school district within a single municipality.
5. For non-partisan elections, the municipal clerk is the filing officer for nomination petitions, designs and prints the ballot and certifies the election results.

F. School Board Secretary*

1. Filing officer for nomination petitions for school board candidates.
2. Draws ballot position for school board elections.

**** It is the school board that sets the hours for a school election and the hourly wages for the district board workers.***

G. Fire District Commission*

1. Clerk of Fire District publishes absentee ballot notice.
2. Fire District Commissioners conduct election.

**** County Clerk provides absentee ballot applications and ballots; County Commissioner of Registration provides registry list, and County Board of Election counts absentee ballots.***

NJ Voter Information

You Can Vote in the Voting Machine if . . .

- Your complete voter registration information is in the poll book,
 - You currently live in the election district or moved out of the County after the close of registration for this election (Thereafter you must be registered in your new County),
 - There are no successful challenges to your right to vote.
- (Instructions on use of the voting machine are available in the polling place. If you do not see them, ask any board worker.)*

Assistance in the Voting Machine

If you are blind, physically disabled or can not read the ballot on the machine, you will be allowed to have someone of your choice in the voting machine to assist you. **BUT** under federal law, you can not get assistance from a representative of your employer or union for federal elections.

If you are alone and are entitled to assistance, two board workers of opposite political parties may help you.

You have the right to have both workers assist you or one worker - It is your choice.

The district board workers must first fill out a disability certificate for you before you go into the voting machine.

Challenge Process

If your right to vote is challenged, the board workers may ask you for identification and you must sign an affidavit.

The challenger must also sign an affidavit.

If the board workers vote to reject the challenge or there is a tie vote on the challenge, you have the right to vote in the voting machine.

If the board votes to uphold the challenge, you may not vote but you have the right to go to a Superior Court Judge to get a court order to vote. The board workers must tell you where to go to see the Judge.

Standing in Line to Vote

If you are in line to vote after the polls have closed - You **MUST** be allowed to vote. Board Workers **CAN NOT** turn you away.

Exit Polling - It Is Legal

You may be asked by a member of the press about your voting when you are leaving the polling place. **You do not have to answer any questions - it is your choice.**

Election Offenses

■ Electioneering -

It is a crime under state law to electioneer within 100 feet from the outside entrance to the polling place up to and including the polling room. There can be no campaign signs or material in this area and no one can campaign on behalf of any candidate or public question to be voted upon.

■ Fraudulent Voting -

It is a crime under federal and state law to attempt to vote or vote knowing you are not entitled to vote or to provide false information when registering to vote or voting. You are **not** permitted to vote more than once in an election.

■ Conspiracy -

It is a federal crime to conspire to deprive voters of a fair election.

Complaint Forms

Forms are available if you have a complaint regarding the conduct of the election at this polling place. Ask any board worker.

ID Requirements for First-time Registrants by Mail Only

1. If you registered to vote by mail in your County after January 1, 2003, and never voted in a federal election in the County, you were required to provide identification. If you did not provide identification before voting for the first time at the polling place **you must show the board workers identification before voting today.**
2. An identifying document may include, **but not limited**, to:
 - Any Valid and Current Photo ID:
 - NJ Driver's License
 - Military or other Government ID
 - Student or Job ID Store Membership Card, **or**,

NJ Voter Information

Any current document that has your name and address on it, **including but not limited to:**

Bank statement	Pay check	Car registration	Rent receipt
Government check or document	Sample ballot	Non-photo NJ driver's license	Utility bill

(If you **DO NOT** show the board workers any identification you **CANNOT** vote in the voting machine. You **MUST** vote with a provisional paper ballot and you will have until the close of business on the second day after the election to provide identification to your county election official.)

Challenger Do's & Don'ts

Challengers **Can:**

1. Challenge a voter if the challenger believes the voter is not qualified to vote.

In order to vote a person must be:

- a United States citizen
- 18 years of age or older
- a resident of the County for at least 30 days before the election
- registered to vote
- not declared legally insane

A person on probation or parole for a felony conviction can not vote.

A challenger must sign an affidavit stating the reason for the challenge.

Challengers **Can Not:**

1. Challenge a voter for any of these reasons:

- a. they think they know how the voter is going to vote
- b. the race or ethnic origin of the voter
- c. the voter resides in a **particular** ward, housing complex, or section of a municipality or county

It is a criminal offense for a challenger to challenge a voter for any of the above 3 reasons.

- 2. Sit with the district board workers or touch the election materials
- 3. Go to the voting machine during the voting hours
- 4. Challenge the voter directly. Only the district board can ask the voter questions.
- 5. Wear any campaign buttons, signs or wear any campaign clothing
- 6. Harass or intimidate any voters; or cause any disturbances in the polling place.
- 7. Challenge a voter because the district board asks the voter to affirm his or her residence or asks a first-time registrant by Mail to show identification.

Provisional Ballot Voting You **MUST** Vote by Provisional Ballot if:

- 1. You are a registered voter in the County who moved and did not notify the County Commissioner of Registration before election day of your current address; therefore your registration information is not in the poll book; **or**,
- 2. Your registration information is not complete in the poll book; for example your signature or address is missing; **or**,
- 3. You are a first-registrant by mail in the county after January 1, 2003 who has not provided identification information.

How to Vote by Provisional Ballot:

- 1. The board worker will give you a paper ballot and an envelope.
- 2. Vote the ballot. The board worker must provide you with a place to vote the ballot in secret.
- 3. Put the voted ballot in the envelope and seal it.
- 4. Complete the "Affirmation Statement" that is attached to the envelope.
- 5. Give the envelope to the board worker.
- 6. Watch the board worker put the envelope in the orange provisional ballot nylon bag.
- 7. You may put your ballot in the orange bag yourself, if you want to instead of the board worker.

No Provisional Ballot is Counted at the Polling Place. All provisional ballots are taken to the County Commissioner of Registration's office after the close of the polls for verification and counting by the County Board of Election

After the election, you can call **1-877-NJ-VOTER** (1-877-658-6837) to find out if your ballot was counted. If your ballot was not counted, you can find out why it was rejected.


Polling District Maps



Voting Terms & Definitions

Absentee Ballot -

any military service ballot or civilian absentee ballot. N.J.S.A. 19:57-2

Absentee Voter -

any person qualified to vote a military service ballot or a civilian absentee ballot. N.J.S.A. 19:57-2

Any Election -

includes all primary, general, municipal, school and special elections, as defined herein. N.J.S.A. 19:1-1

Armed Forces of the United States -

any branch or department of the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard or Marine Corps. N.J.S.A. 19:57-2

Automatic Tabulating Equipment -

includes apparatus which automatically examines and counts votes recorded on ballot cards, and tabulates the results. N.J.S.A. 19:53A-1a

Ballot -

except when reference is made to irregular ballots, means that portion of the cardboard or paper within the ballot frames containing the name of the candidate and the designation of the party by which he was nominated, or a statement of a proposed constitutional amendment, or other question or proposition with the word "yes" for voting for any question or proposition, and the word "no" for voting against any question. N.J.S.A. 19:47-1

Ballot Card -

a tabulating card on which votes may be recorded. N.J.S.A. 19:53A-1b

Ballot Labels -

the pages, cards, or other material containing the names of offices and candidates and the statement of measures to be voted on, which are placed on the voting device. N.J.S.A. 19:53A-1c

Circulator -

an individual, whether paid or unpaid, who solicits signatures for a recall petition. N.J.S.A. 19:27A-3

Commissioner -

the commissioner of registration in counties. N.J.S.A. 19:1-1

County Board -

the county board of elections in a county. N.J.S.A. 19:1-1

County Boards of Elections -

the county board of elections appointed in the various counties or the person or board in charge of elections in the various counties as provided in Title 19 of the New Jersey Revised Statutes. N.J.S.A. 19:53A-1g

Counting Center -

one or more locations selected by each of the county boards of election for the automatic counting of ballots. N.J.S.A. 19:53A-1d

Civilian Absentee Ballot -

a ballot for use by a civilian absentee voter. N.J.S.A. 19:57-2

Civilian Absentee Voter -

any qualified and registered voter of the State. N.J.S.A. 19:57-2

District Board -

the district board of registry and election in an election district. N.J.S.A. 19:1-1

Glossary

Election -

the procedure whereby the electors of this State or any political subdivision thereof elect persons to fill public office or pass on public questions. N.J.S.A. 19:1-1

Voting Terms & Definitions (cont'd)

Election District -

the territory within which or for which there is a polling place or room for all voters in the territory to cast their ballots at any election. N.J.S.A. 19:1-1

Elected Official -

any person holding the office of United States Senator or member of the United States House of Representatives elected from this State, or any person holding a State or local government office which, under the State Constitution or by law, is filled by the registered voters of a jurisdiction at an election, including a person appointed, selected or otherwise designated to fill a vacancy in such office, but does not mean an official of a political party. N.J.S.A. 19:27A-3

Electronic Voting System -

a system in which votes are recorded on ballot cards, and such votes are subsequently counted and tabulated by automatic tabulating equipment at one or more counting centers. N.J.S.A. 19:53A-1e

Family Member -

an adult who is a spouse, parent, child, grandparent, grandchild or sibling of a voter, whether by adoption or natural relationship. It shall also include any adult occupant regularly living with a voter in any residential building or part of a building intended for the use of no more than one family. N.J.S.A. 19:57-2

Federal Election -

any general, special or primary held for the purpose of nominating or electing any candidate for the office of President or Vice President of the United States, Presidential elector, United States Senator or member of the United States House of Representatives. N.J.S.A. 19:59-2c

File or Filed -

deposited in the regularly maintained office of the public official wherever said regularly maintained office is designated by statute, ordinance or resolution. N.J.S.A. 19:1-1

General Election -

the annual election to be held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November. N.J.S.A. 19:1-1

Incapacitated Absentee Voter -

a voter who, due to incapacity, is unable to complete his ballot. N.J.S.A. 19:57-2

Irregular Ballot -

a vote cast, by or on a special device, for a person whose name does not appear on the ballots. N.J.S.A. 19:47-1

Jurisdiction -

the electoral jurisdiction, including but not limited to the State, or any county or municipality thereof, within which the voters reside who are qualified to vote for an elected official who is sought to be recalled. N.J.S.A. 19:27A-3

Masculine -

includes the feminine, and the masculine pronoun wherever used in this Title shall be construed to include the feminine. N.J.S.A. 19:1-1

Member of the Maritime or Merchant Marine Service -

any person employed as an officer or crew member of a vessel documented under the laws of the United States, or a vessel owned by the United States, or a vessel of foreign-flag registry under charter to or control of the United States or enrolled with the United States for employment or training for employment, or maintained by the United States for emergency relief service as an officer or crew member of any such vessel or any such person as otherwise defined in section 107 of Pub.L. 99-410, the "Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act," (42 U.S.C.1973ff-6). N.J.S.A. 19:57-2

Military Service -

active service by any person, as a member of any branch or department of the United States Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard or Marine Corps, or as a member of the maritime or merchant marine service, or as a reservist absent from his place of residence and undergoing training under Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard or Marine Corps direction, at a place other than that of such person's residence. N.J.S.A. 19:57-2

Military Service Ballot -

a ballot for use by a military service voter. N.J.S.A. 19:57-2

Military Service Voter -

a qualified elector under the constitution and laws of this State who comes within one of the following categories:

- (a) Persons in the military service and their spouses and dependents.
- (b) Patients in a veteran's hospital located in any place other than the place of their residences who have been in the military service in any war in which the United States has been engaged and have been discharged or released from such service.
- (c) Civilians attached to or serving with the armed forces of the United States without this State and their spouses and dependents when residing with or accompanying them. N.J.S.A. 19:57-2

Municipal Election -

an election to be held in and for a single municipality only, at regular intervals. N.J.S.A. 19:1-1

Municipality -

includes any city, town, borough, village, or township. N.J.S.A. 19:19:1-1

Non-Partisan -

In some municipalities, members of the local governing body are elected in May. Candidates for office do not run as officially affiliated with organized political parties. N.J.S.A. 40:45-7

Notice of Intention -

the notice filed with the recall election official by a recall committee for the purpose of initiating a recall effort. N.J.S.A. 19:27A-3

Official Ballot -

the printed strips of cardboard or paper containing the names of the candidates nominated and a statement of the questions submitted. N.J.S.A. 19:47-1

Overseas Federal Election Voter -

any person in military service who, by reason of active duty or service, is absent on the date of an election from the place of residence in New Jersey where the person is or would be qualified to vote, and any citizen of the United States residing abroad who

- (1) immediately prior to his departure from the United States was domiciled in New Jersey and
 - (a) was registered to vote, or had all the qualifications to register and vote, in New Jersey; or
 - (b) had all the qualifications to register and vote in New Jersey other than having attained 18 years of age but has since attained that age; or
 - (c) would, but for residence, have the qualifications to register and vote in New Jersey;
- (2) does not maintain a Residence in the United States and is not registered or qualified to vote elsewhere in the United States; and
- (3) holds a valid passport or card of identity and registration issued under authority of the Secretary of State of the United States. N.J.S.A. 19:59-2d

Party Office -

the office of delegate or alternate to the national convention of a political party or member of the State, county or municipal committees of a political party. N.J.S.A. 19:1-1

Voting Terms & Definitions (cont'd)

Political Party -

a party which, at the election held for all of the members of the General Assembly next preceding the holding of any primary election held pursuant to this Title, polled for members of the General Assembly at least 10% of the total vote cast in this State. N.J.S.A. 19:19:1-1

Presidential Ballot -

a ballot to be cast at a Presidential Election pursuant to this act. N.J.S.A. 19:58-2

Presidential Election -

an election to be held for the election of electors for President and Vice-President of the United States. N.J.S.A. 19:58-2

Presidential Year -

the year in which electors of President and Vice-President of the United States are voted for at the general election. N.J.S.A. 19:1-1

Primary Election -

the procedure whereby the members of a political party in this State or any political subdivision thereof nominate candidates to be voted for at general elections, or elect persons to fill party offices, or delegates and alternates to national conventions. N.J.S.A. 19:1-1

Protective Counter -

a separate counter built into the voting machine which cannot be reset, which records the total number of movements of the operating lever. N.J.S.A. 19:47-1

Public Office -

includes any office in the government of this State or any of its political subdivisions filled at elections by the electors of the State or political subdivision. N.J.S.A. 19:1-1

Public Question -

includes any question, proposition or referendum required by the legislative or governing body of this State or any of its political subdivisions to be submitted by referendum procedure to the voters of the State or political subdivision for decision at elections. N.J.S.A. 19:1-1

Question -

includes any constitutional amendment, proposition or other question submitted to the voters at any election. N.J.S.A. 19:47-1

Recall Committee -

a committee formed by persons sponsoring the recall of an elected official which represents the sponsors and signers of a recall petition in matters relating to the recall effort. N.J.S.A. 19:27A-3

Recall Election -

an election held for the purpose of allowing the voters of a jurisdiction to decide whether an elected official shall be recalled from office. N.J.S.A. 19:27A-3

Recall Election Official -

the official authorized by law to receive nominating petitions for an elective office, except that with respect to the recall of the county clerk, it means the Secretary of State. N.J.S.A. 19:27A-3

Recall Petition -

a petition prepared and circulated by a recall committee as provided by this act for the purpose of gathering a sufficient number of valid signatures of registered voters to cause a recall election to be called. N.J.S.A. 19:27A-3
